Always check the online store

Always check the website

There are scammers with unsafe websites, where they offer expensive brands at lower prices, for example. If you buy something there, you won't get it. You'll lose your money.

They might also ask you to click on a link, so they can access your information.

Such websites often resemble existing websites, but they are slightly different. How do you recognize these sites?

First, the web address is different. For example, there might be an extra word or hyphen.

Second, there's no company address or phone number on the site. They're unreachable.

Finally, the offers are often too good to be true. Pay extra attention.

So: Always check the website:

1 Check the web address.

2 Check for contact information.

3 Check if offers are too good to be true.

This way, you're staying safe online.

Man 2: If you could just click here to pay...

Man 1: Here.

Woman: No, I don't trust that website!

Man 2: You can just give me a little nudge, right?

Woman: No, I can't! And I don't trust you either.

Man 1: Well...

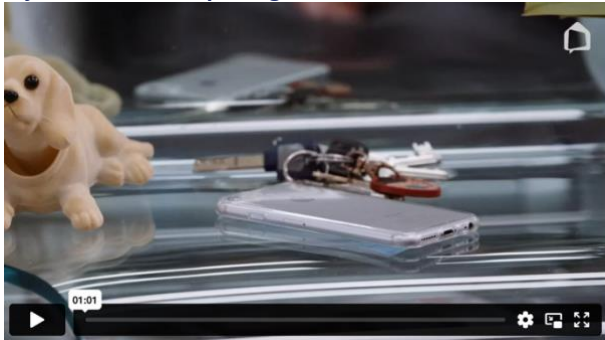
Man 2: We can just talk about this, can't we?

Marlies: Thanks. So, he's going to buy a new scooter. He needs to ride a bike! It'll give him strong calves.

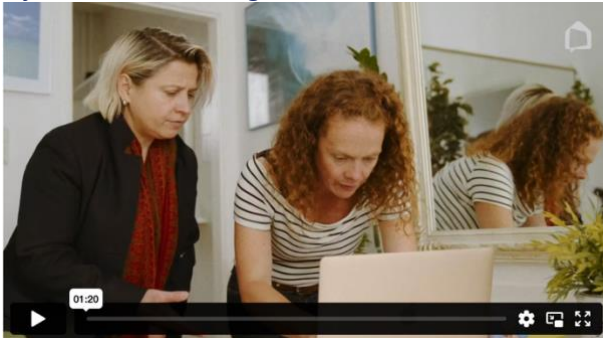
Hairdresser: Shall we get started?

Marlies: Click that link, of course, check my account.

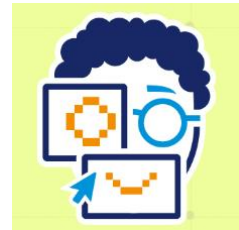
Neighbor: Wait, wait, wait, the first thing you should do in a situation like this: "don't panic, stay calm."

Secure your devices

Secure your device

Criminals can break into your computer, tablet, or phone.

Just like you secure your home, it's important to secure your devices.

You do this first with a code or password. You can't use the computer if you don't enter the code or password.

Secondly, it's important to install the updates on your device. You can set your computer to install these updates automatically. This keeps your computer, tablet, or phone secure.

Finally, it's important not to let strangers use your computer or phone.

So: Secure your device:

1. Lock it with a code or password.
2. Install updates immediately.
3. Don't give strangers access to your devices.

This way, you're safe online.

Woman: No, you won't get my code. I don't let strangers use my computer!

Woman: I'd rather call a good friend if I need help!
